### Airport Transfers

Arrival information must be sent to EC as soon as possible otherwise clients will not receive airport transfers. When students arrive at the airport they must proceed to the EC stand where an EC representative will be waiting for them. The EC stand is situated in a prominent location in the arrivals hall. The EC representative will provide an Adult Handbook together with a Student ID Card, answer any questions and take the student to their transport.

### Adult Handbook

Students receive an Adult Handbook and a Student ID Card either on arrival at the airport, or delivered to their accommodation, if transfers are not required. If EC is not informed where the student will be staying, the student should collect the Adult Handbook and a Student ID from the reception on their first day of school. This handbook contains a map and useful information for the students' time in Malta. The Student ID clearly states on the back the time the student must be in school for their placement test.

### Placement Tests

The time of the placement test will vary according to the time of year, it is normally between 07:15 and 08:00. The exact time students have to be in school is printed clearly on their Student ID Card. It is very important the student is punctual to ensure everything runs smoothly. The placement test assesses the student in listening reading and writing, allowing academic staff to place students in the relevant group for their ability.

### Welcome Talk

After the student completes the placement test (which normally takes 1.5 hours to complete), they will proceed to a welcome talk given by the academic staff and the customer relations department.

### Lessons

Students will be placed in their classes by the start of the second module at 11:30 to begin lessons.

### Welcome Dinner

The Welcome Dinner is held on Monday, in a traditional Maltese farmhouse which was once a milling factory. It is an excellent way for newcomers to break the ice and get to know each other. Dinner includes a wide range of Maltese food with local wine.
